GATHER UP THE FRAGMENTS

Five loaves and two small fishes were far too little for that great crowd; but in the hands of Jesus, and by virtue of his thanksgiving, they became much more than enough. In gratitude for the gifts of God he bade his disciples gather up the fragments that remained, that none be lost: and they gathered twelve baskets full - more than enough for twelve apostles to feed the twelve tribes of Israel. It is a sign that in their witness to Christ, in the gospel they went out to preach, they fed the elect, gathered out of many nations into one Church, with the bread of eternal life.

What a feast! How very little we give to God - and how very much he gives us in return! This week the Church's year of grace comes to an end, and we observe the day of National Thanksgiving. Our gratitude for the feast of God's blessings is this: that we gather up the fragments that remain, that nothing be lost. Such gratitude is good stewardship, that none of God's good gifts should go to waste: we gather the fragments, so that we may have something with which to feed the hungry. God may justly bring us into want of those

gifts which we waste; he may justly take away his gifts from those who despise them; gather the fragments that remain, that no one be lost!

The communion of saints (*sanctorum*) is both the sharing of God's holy gifts (*sancta*) and the fellowship of his holy people (*sancti*) in one Body in Christ. As Christ gives his Church all that is his, so we share with one another all that he has given us. This sharing is participation, communion, or fellowship (it is the same word in Greek, *koinonia*). By "fellowship" we usually mean shared service (such as that found in the Bazaar, the Choir, the Chancel Society), shared hospitality (Coffee Hour, Receptions after Evensong, the annual Stewardship Sunday Brunch, and the Oyster Roast), and yes, shared fun (which may or may not include the Golf Tournament). Let us be grateful for these expressions of fellowship, in which the bonds of affection are indeed exercised - yet without mistaking them for the essence of fellowship itself. For there are all kinds of fellowships out there, bad and good - a criminal gang, a social club,

an army unit – but what holds a *Christian* community together is the sharing of a common faith, a common hope and a common charity, made possible by the gifts of God's grace and mercy in Christ.

Our common faith is grounded in the Word of God; our common hope in Prayer; our common charity in the Sacraments; and thus it is the church's common prayers, the ministry of Word and Sacraments, that is the matrix of fellowship that is in Christ. Our fellowship, our service, our mission and ministry, all of these find their proper place and value within the frame of Common Prayer.

For the Church's Common Prayer to be a frame for common life, each one of us must give himself up to its requirements. The sharing of a common faith, hope, and charity requires a willingness to receive and a willingness to give; to listen and to speak; to be taught and to teach others; to forgive, and to be forgiven; to love and be loved; to take one's place and to make place for others. The opinionated person sure of his views must learn to set them to one side, submitting himself to an objective order; the reserved and isolated person must learn to open his heart and make space within for the concerns of others. In one, the self must be renounced (humility); in the other it must be expanded (charity). In such use and exercise of his gifts do we prove ourselves worthy of them.

Let us ask him for one more gift: that he preserve us from despising or presuming upon his goodness. Lord, thou hast given us so many good things; give us each one thing more: a grateful heart.
