The Third Sunday in Advent

THE WILLIAM RALSTON

LISTENING LIBRARY & ARCHIVE

Last weekend I travelled (for the first time) to the University of the South at Sewanee – an historic Episcopalian and quintessentially Southern institution of which our first rector, Bishop Stephen Elliott, was a founder. High in the ancient wooded mountains of southeastern Tennessee, its fabled campus of stone-built Gothic revival buildings – “the mountain” or “the domain” – glowed golden in the winter sunlight.

What brought me to Sewanee was the pleasure and honour of representing St. John's Church at the formal opening and dedication of the William Ralston Listening Room and Archive - a project supported by this church and a number of individual parishioners, as well as former students of Fr Ralston's at Sewanee, where he was successively Professor of Ethics, Moral and Philosophical Theology, an editor of the important literary journal, *The Sewanee Review*, and a popular Professor of English.

During his lifetime, Fr Ralston systematically assembled one of the nation's most comprehensive and private collections of classical music – about 10,000 recordings in all, analogue and digital. (His frequent shipments of CDs would be greeted with the words “yum, yum!”) This collection is now housed in a state-of-the art facility at the university Library next to the university's collection of musical scores (a collection named in honour of Fr Ralston's good friend and mentor, Charles Harrison). At the heart of the library is a cherry-panelled listening room designed by a leading acoustic

engineer and equipped with audio and video equipment of astonishing high quality. The University's circulating collection of 5000 audio recordings is located next door in the elegant “Savannah Room”, given by the Hungerpiller family. The Listening Room was to have been named in honour of Jim and Page Hungerpiller, but they preferred it to be named in honour of Fr Ralston's good friend, and the driving force behind this project, Tam Carlson, who with his dear wife Chris, is a longstanding friend of this parish.

Tam Carlson and the donors who supported this project have accomplished a memorial worthy of Fr Ralston's life and teaching - precisely because it is not a “monument” to something now past and gone, but the means of transmitting to future generations a living tradition of Christian humanism of which he was so great a teacher. It exemplifies what was perhaps the first and abiding principle of almost everything he did: that the best and highest achievements of culture – like the highest accomplishments of thought and faith – deserve the best and highest from us. Not to take seriously these things - the best intimations we have in this world of the good, the beautiful, the true – is not to be serious about being human. Cranmer's collect for the Second Sunday in Advent guides us in the proper approach. He is speaking of the Scriptures, but the principle is more generally applicable: “grant that we may in such wise hear them, read, mark,
