The Second Sunday in Epiphany

'BEAMING FROM EAR TO EAR'

My first notice was a note in the collection plate, telling me St. John's had been visited by an anonymous "church reviewer", whose report could be found on the website of "Ship of Fools". With some trepidation - Ship of Fools can be scathing - I ventured to the site, but found a rather objective description of what it is like to visit St. John's for the first time. The reviewer and her party found the atmosphere before the service "very quiet. There was an almost inaudible murmur but conversation was extremely limited. There was no organ music before the service, which seemed strange to me and my small group." The stillness before the service does feel a little odd when you are not used to it, but it is deliberate. Stillness is a condition of recognizing God's presence and hearing his word. "God is in his holy temple: let all the earth keep silence before him" (Habakkuk 2:10). Organ music before the service only encourages people to chat.

Our visitor, and her party, was struck by "how very well dressed everyone was. Obviously going to church was the big occasion and so everyone dressed accordingly". Which is to say, the congregation is dressed as if the worship of God, and not their own comfort, is what matters - complete

with "some distracting hats on display". (Distracting hats? bring'em on!). She was also impressed by the discipline of the congregation during the service: "exceptionally well behaved ... there were no problems with distracting chatting in the service or beeps of technology".

After service, the visitors "hung around... looking lost", waiting to see how the congregation dealt with strangers in their midst: "as soon as the service finished we were immediately quizzed as to who we were and where were we from. We were repeatedly invited to join them for coffee in the parish rooms." I can never know what it is like to visit St. John's as a stranger, and it is deeply gratifying to find that there was nothing chilly or perfunctory about the welcome these folk received. The "after service coffee hour was not just coffee and tea, but hot appetizers and various sweet cakes. We could have had lunch, never mind just a drink! I cannot think of a church where we have been made so welcome on our travels. Well done, St John's Church!" And I say 'well done' too. The ministry of hospitality exercised by the women of the Church at Coffee Hour is one of the great strengths of our congregation - as this visitor's testimony confirms. "Be not forgetful to entertain strangers: for thereby

some have entertained angels unawares" (Hebrews 13:2).

As for the liturgy itself - sung Litany and Eucharist - Dr. Taylor "made the organ sound wonderful"; the choir was "lovely"; Fr O'Brien's sermon, unusually short for St. John's (one wonders how she would have responded to the Rector's twenty- minute discourse), was well received; and, "it was so wonderful to hear again the old liturgy with which my friend and I had grown up." We agree!

One wonders, naturally, how a visitor would have reacted who was *not* familiar with the Prayer Book. How grim if we had failed to reach our "core constituency" - but perhaps the response would be different, and not as immediate, for someone from outside it. That is not an argument against the Prayer Book (outsiders are always with us) – but for adopting a rather more “missionary” stance than Episcopalians sometimes do. If we assume that the Prayer Book is only for those who grew up with it, we set ourselves up for irrelevance.

It is striking how important a role the congregation played in this visitor's experience. Important as the liturgy, sermon, and music are, so also was the congregation's reverence and self-restraint before and during the service, as well as their warm and generous welcome after. The worship of God is a *corporate* act of clergy and people in faith toward God and love for neighbor.

On the question of "how would you feel about making this church your regular (where 10 = ecstatic, 0 = terminal)?" our score was a very gratifying 9. On the question of "Did the service make you feel glad to be a Christian? The reviewer answered: "Absolutely. We all left beaming from

ear to ear and felt our spiritual batteries had been well and truly regenerated."

What made this review even more gratifying to me was knowing that I was out of town that Sunday. Well done, St. John's. GGD
